Sometimes, pharmacists mix the medicine themselves. Most often, though, they use medicines that are already made.



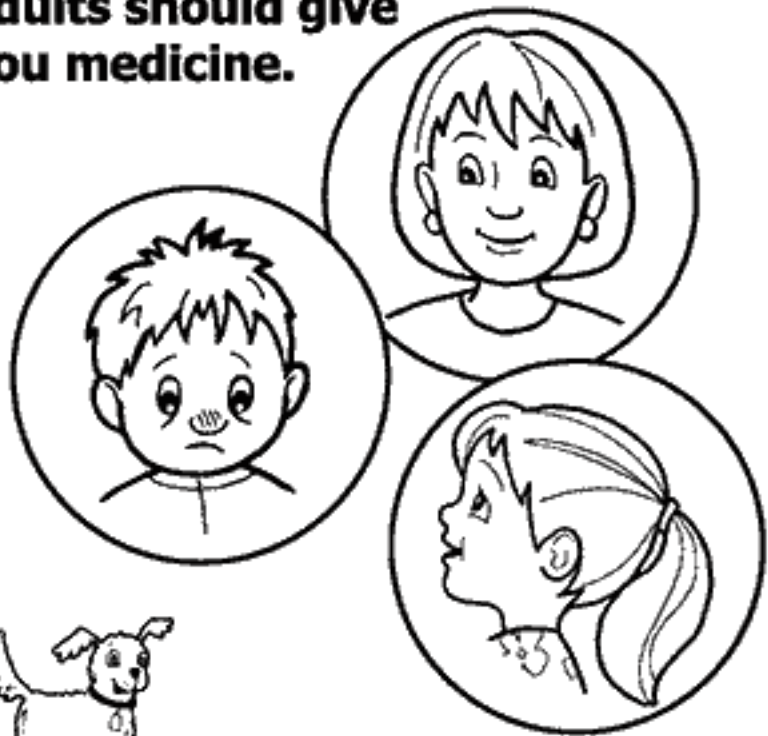
The pharmacist gave my mom the medicine and told her how my baby brother should take it.

Medicine is Not candy!



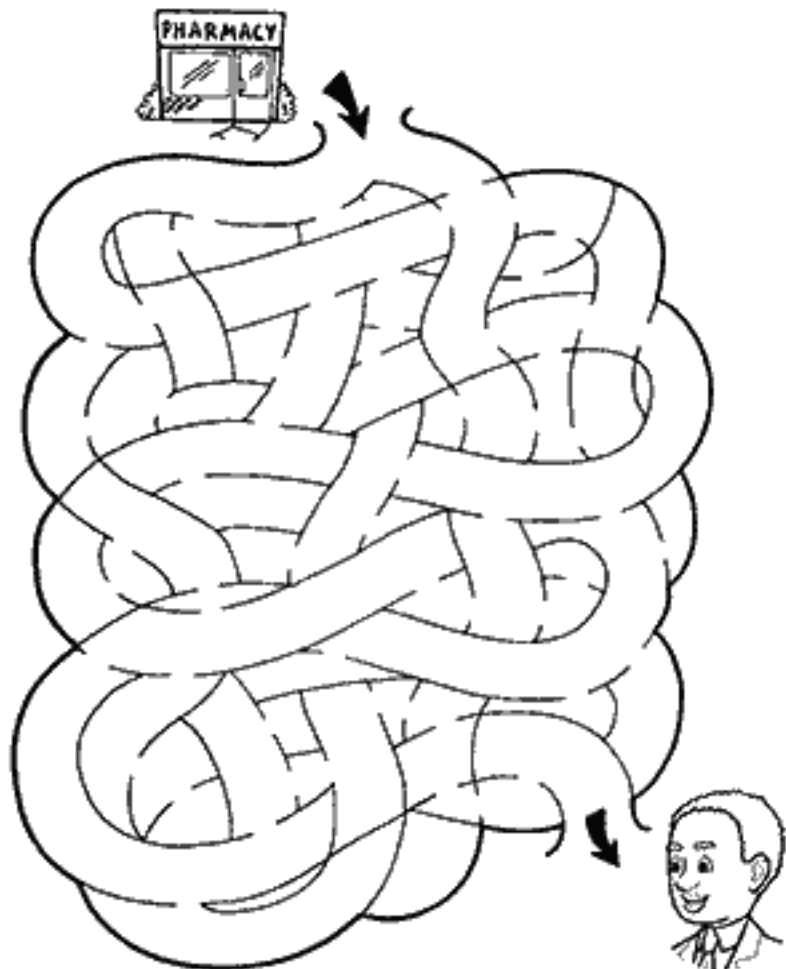
**Medicine can be dangerous
