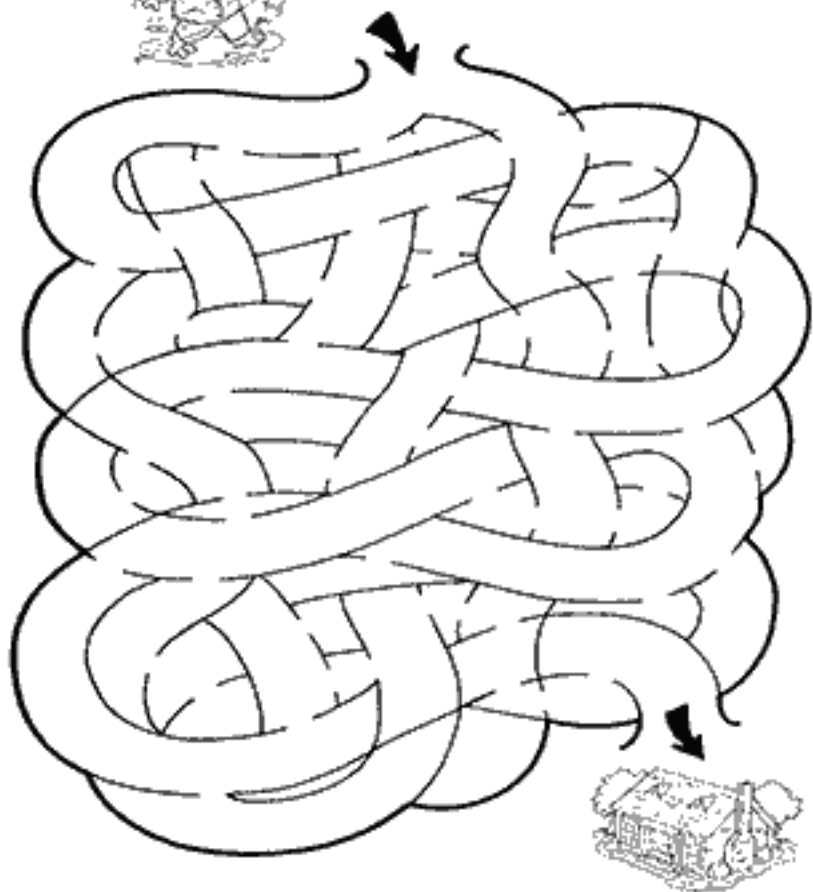

It's raining! Help Wally find his way home in the storm.



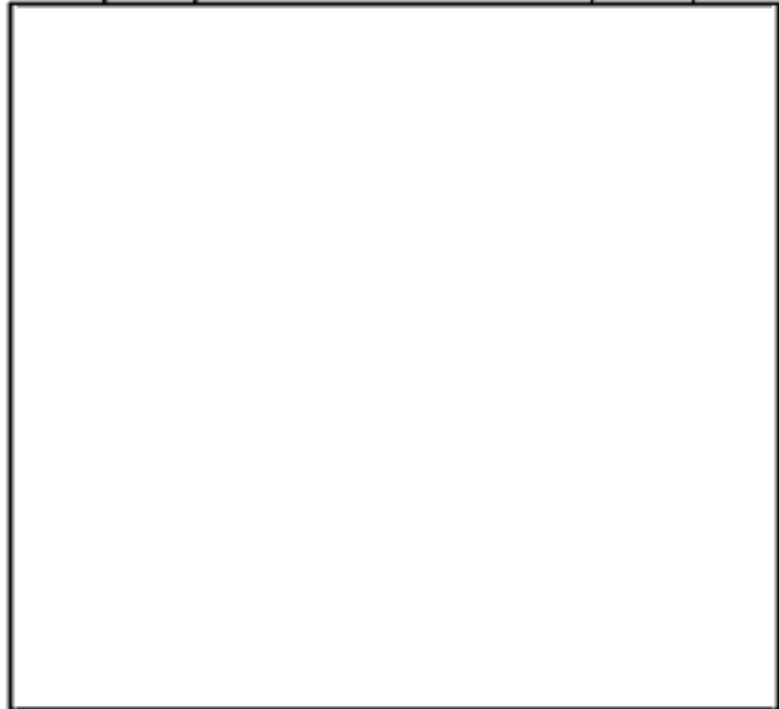
Let's Draw!
